Our partnership with Mitch Dunitz, supporting college bridge in new ways, is something that provides much excitement and innovation.


Help develop a future leader for youth and young adult bridge – Amber Lin! We are already seeing so many exciting ideas from our collaborations.

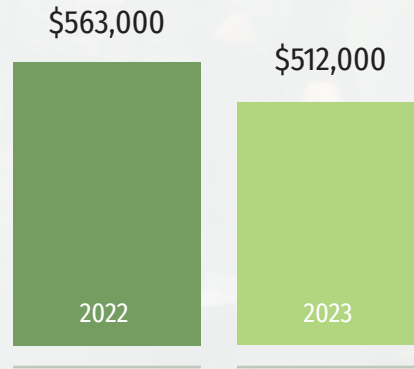

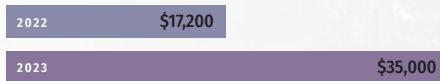

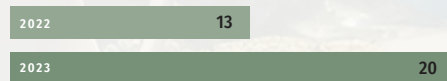

Our 2023 calendar year saw incredible growth in our efforts to support the learning, play, competition and enjoyment of bridge, helping to lay the groundwork for a bright bridge future! Among our success, ACBLEF:

- Increased the number of grants awarded by 56% over the prior year.
- Supported digital, hybrid and in-person summer camps to support youth players learning and loving bridge.
- Provided over \$250,000 in funding to support youth and women's teams representing the US, increasing new player engagement, research into the impact of bridge on school age children and new ways to bring the mindsport into the classroom and afterschool programs, growth of community-based bridge clubs, college scholarships and much more.
 - Launched initiative to support JumpStart Bridge to work with gifted teachers across North America to train them on teaching and incorporating bridge into their gifted programming.
 - Updating and streamlining the ACBLEF Grant Process to make online applications more accessible and to provide pre-submission access to our executive director to strengthen applications.
 - Held 2nd Annual Spark! Auction and Live Celebrity Event benefiting junior players and supporting their opportunities to learn, grow and compete at a higher level.

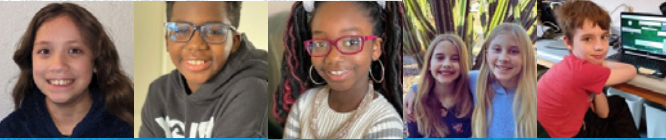
2023 ACBL Grant Recipients

- MoKan Bridge Spring Youth Education Program: To offer 45-minute lessons and supervised game play to youth on Sunday afternoons in the Spring.
- Bridge4Youth Hybrid Summer Camp: To provide a fun, interactive hybrid in-person and online bridge camp to over 100 youth.
- Bridge The Ultimate Mind Game: Creating a three-part docuseries on the game of bridge to entertain, engage, and attract new players.
- ACBL Unit 431: Victoria and Gulf Islands: To subsidize player entry fees to the Bridge Lite Program.
- MoKan Summer Youth Program: To provide a summer program of eight 45-minute bridge lessons to youth ages 8-18 of any skill level.
- RONA 2nd Women's Team: To grow the number of young women in bridge by funding the second US team in the U26 Women's category at the Junior World Championships in Veldhoven, Netherlands.
- SPIN Chicago: To host a Collegiate Bowl Social to provide a safe, fun and engaging space for college players to gather, play together, and provide feedback on further ways to build collegiate and young adult programs.
- Atlanta Junior Bridge JumpStart Bridge: To grow outreach opportunities to teachers and students through the unique JumpStart Bridge model.
- Pilot Program CU Students to Chicago: To support pilot program engaging college students.
- USA2 RONA 2023 (U26 Women's Team): Additional support to six young women on the second US team in the U26 Junior World Championships.
- Bridge4Youth In Person Club: To provide 20 in person junior games over the course of 10 months.
- Ontario Bridge Club: To recruit new players and grow the program.
- WashU Bridge Club: To support "Come Learn Bridge in a Day."
- Atlanta NABC Junior Bridge Night: Young player social engagement at Fall NABC.
- ACBL "Come Play Spades with Us": Engaging players in alternative games to recruit new participants via common ground games, while having a fun interactive experience.
- Bridge Club at Georgia Tech: Supporting intercollegiate competition opportunities.
- Bridge as a Mindsport for All (BAMSA) Study: Researching the impacts and barriers of bridge in schools and among youth various stages of relevant growth and development.
- Teacher Assist Grant: Supporting bridge teachers by covering essential program costs including textbooks.

BridgeWhiz is an innovative online course designed to teach children in grades 4 through 12 the essentials of a fascinating game whose benefits, intellectual stimulation, and adventure will last a lifetime!



BridgeWhiz has wrapped up its 3rd year of helping young people learn how to play Bridge, with the help of our knowledgeable and dedicated BridgeWhiz teachers! In 2023, we transitioned from advertising BridgeWhiz to school districts via digital backpack flyers to a more organic approach to registration focused on supporting course completion.

For 2023, a total of 241 students registered for either the Fall or Winter programs, all without any paid advertising!

This year we successfully were able to use the unique learning management system to host all our classes, track student attendance, and protect student and family online privacy and security.

Also new for 2023, was an 8-week improver module to help students build their capacity on competitive bidding, which is one of the trickiest parts of our favorite mindsport.

As we look forward into year four of BridgeWhiz, we plan to implement some additional minor changes align it with both programming needs and evolving strategies for growth and retention throughout the duration of each course.

We are thankful to our BridgeWhiz program coordinator, Keith Hafen, for his continued efforts in managing all the components of BridgeWhiz and to our fantastic BridgeWhiz teachers who provide their students with an exciting window into the wide world of bridge.

- BridgeWhiz is designed for beginner bridge players, with opportunities for graduates to continue lessons at all skill levels through grade 12.
- Weekly classes are offered at different times in multiple time zones to accommodate busy schedules.
- Our partners include the American Contract Bridge League (ACBL), American Bridge Teachers Association (ABTA), and SharkBridge.
- All teachers are fully vetted, certified bridge teachers with expertise in the SharkBridge teacher console.
- An assistant teacher is assigned to every teacher to assist in digitally monitoring each child's screen to ensure no student falls behind.
- Opportunities to play in youth tournaments locally, nationally, and internationally.

The 2nd Annual ACBL Educational Foundation Spark! Auction and Celebrity Event in July 2023 was a successful and exciting opportunity for the bridge world to support the junior bridge player community. This event directly benefits the ACBLEF Spark! Fund, which makes it possible for young players to learn, focus on playing, and grow their skills. The generosity of event supporters, from volunteers to pro players to donors, increases support for programs reaching into schools and universities to engage youth in bridge through teaching, play, and competition that drives their growth and passion. In 2023, contributions to Spark! led to many successes, including:

- Supporting young women traveling to the Netherlands to represent the U.S. in the Junior World Championships.
- Providing textbooks and learning materials for bridge camps and courses across North America.
- Awarding travel packages to teams and pairs for the Collegiate Bridge Bowl and bestowing university scholarships to the top winners.

Many young players who’ve benefited from our support in the past have progressed to compete in adulthood, and they have served as role models to younger peers, encouraging them to stick to the game. Those who have not built a profession around bridge have applied similar critical thinking skills they’ve obtained from playing bridge to the successful careers they have today. Support of the Spark! Charity Auction and Fund helps the ACBLEF ensure this vital work continues!

Participants in Spark 2023 had multiple opportunities to get involved. They could bid on a chance to play alongside some of the world’s top players, celebrities, authors, and legends. Or guests could grab their favorite partner and challenge some bridge celebrities and peers. As they interacted via voice and video, players had the opportunity to be immersed in the excitement of the game while having an absolute blast playing alongside their bridge heroes. Additionally, they received a personalized hand analysis by renowned bridge writer and player Barry Rigal. For the folks who prefer to watch, they could choose instead the Backstage Pass option and Kibitz with guest commentary from ACBL Executive Director Bronia Jenkins and Barry Rigal. Following the game, an exclusive online after-party let guests mingle and connect with the experts.

CONVERSATION WITH AMBER LIN

Amber Y. Lin, 26, is a business consultant at Bain & Company. She is also one of America's rising young stars in bridge –last year she won the European Youth Pairs championship in the Netherlands for players under 31 with her boyfriend, Kevin Rosenberg, and also was on the team that won the Wuhan Cup at the World Bridge Teams Championships in Morocco.

Last year, Amber took a leave of absence from Bain to serve as an intern for the ACBL Educational Foundation, and now that she has returned to Bain, she continues to work part-time with the Foundation along with other bridge volunteering.

I caught up with Amber recently by phone, to talk about her life as a consultant, a bridge player and a bridge volunteer. Here are some highlights from our conversation:

JOEL: Tell me a little about your career outside of bridge.

AMBER: I work at Bain as an energy consultant. I love my work, because I get to help companies as they transition to renewable energy. Also, Bain is very flexible about giving me time to pursue my passion for bridge.

JOEL: How did you become involved with the ACBL Educational Foundation?

AMBER: Bain encourages its consultants to take some time off after the first few years working there to do other things, which frequently means working with a nonprofit. I wanted to do something related to bridge, and the Educational Foundation seemed like a good idea. The Foundation offered me an internship.

JOEL: So what did you do for the Foundation?

AMBER: First I worked with Tracey Bauer on the second annual Spark! charity auction the Foundation held to raise money to support youth bridge. We solicited the things to auction off, which mostly involved recruiting professional players to partner with the highest bidder to play in an online pro-am event. Then we marketed the event to make sure there were plenty of bidders. It was a big success.

Later in the year, I focused on understanding the youth bridge landscape in the U.S., and putting together a strategy for filling gaps. For example, young adults. We have youth and collegiate programs, but what do we do after they graduate from college and enter the workforce? Can we get corporate games started, for example? Another issue was lack of in-person training opportunities for young players. This year, we're working on a training camp for high-level players and a bridge camp for players at all levels. There are some existing camps for young players, and those need promoting. Also, I got involved in re-starting in-person teaching for youth in the Bay Area with Silicon Valley Youth Bridge, which had been suspended since Covid hit. We started piloting new programs – for example, Junior Nights at the national tournaments. At the Atlanta NABC, this included learning from a panel of expert players, followed by dinner and non-bridge games for fun. But a lot of people ended up playing bridge!

JOEL: What are your impressions of the Educational Foundation?

AMBER: I didn't know much about the Foundation before I came to intern. I'm very impressed. It serves a really important purpose, providing both the thinking and the money to support educational activities in bridge. The people involved are really passionate and thoughtful, and they move ideas along at a good pace.

JOEL: Now that you're back at Bain, how much time do you have for bridge, and how do you divide that time between playing and volunteering?

AMBER: I spend more time on volunteering than anything else. I volunteer every Thursday and Friday evening and on Saturdays. I'll play in local Unit Games and Sectionals on weekends too, but I mainly use vacations and other time off to play in major tournaments.

JOEL: Tell us about the volunteering you're doing now.

AMBER: On Thursday nights, Kevin and I teach an online class with advanced junior players on cardplay using the platform SharkBridge, inspired by the Educational Foundation's BridgeWhiz program. On Friday nights, we do in-person youth bridge in the Bay Area, with pizza, mainly for beginners. I enjoy it because it's in-person, and it's interesting to work with young kids. Some want to be constantly challenged, and others find it an interesting break from their schoolwork. On Saturday, I work online with young women who represent the USA at junior world championships and who aspire to become top players

JOEL: Why do you work especially with young women?

AMBER: There's a gender gap in bridge. But not only in bridge. It's also in chess, in STEM programs, higher-level positions in business, and many other fields. There's less of a gap with younger people, like in middle school. But for many young women, there may be discomfort learning and playing in a male-dominated environment. I'm passionate about creating a safe, positive place for young women to get better at bridge.

I learned to play in middle school, but got serious about it only in college. I try to provide the mentorship that I wish I had had when I started out.

JOEL: Between work and bridge, do you have much time for anything else?

AMBER: Not much. I like to sing and play piano, and I'll do that sometimes at Bain employee events.

JOEL: How do you think we can attract more young people to play bridge throughout North America?

AMBER: I've been thinking about chess as a great example for us. The level of awareness among young people of chess is high. The partnership element makes bridge more complicated, and we won't get a lot of kids to come to the local clubs to play with older people. We need in-person events exclusively for young people, and they need to combine learning with fun. Bridge has a big learning curve, so we need to get people to come regularly.

JOEL: I learned to play in high school, but at 22 life intruded and I gave it up for about 40 years. Now, I'm back and play a lot – though not at your level! I think there are a lot of people like me who have returned to the game later in life, and others taking it up for the first



time as a retirement activity. This is another of the Foundation's priorities. Do you have any advice for how to reach older players?

AMBER: That's not my area of expertise. I relate well to young people, because I'm still sort of one of them. I know that some of the young people we work with won't keep playing. But when that happens, I hope they'll play casually sometimes and come back to bridge later in life like you did.
